Grown in Norfolk SHOW RULES

GENERAL

- Entries are open to anyone, from anywhere and of any age.
- 50p per class entry, capped at a maximum charge of £5 per person.
- Entry into the competition does not entitle competitors to enter the Festival, there is a separate charge for this.
- Enter as many classes as you wish, but only one entry per class.
- Entries must arrive, with a completed entry form and entry fee between:
6.30pm–7.30pm Friday 27th July – Next to Pimms tent on the playing field
10am–11am on Saturday the 28th July at the Grown in Norfolk tent on Mill Hill
- Judging will take place between 1 & 2pm on Saturday 28th July, during which time all competitors must vacate the Grown in Norfolk tent.
- All entries must remain until 3.30pm but collected by 5pm on the day of the show.
- An auction of donated items (as indicated on the entry form) will be held at 4pm.
- There are no monetary prizes, just certificates and personal satisfaction.
- All monies raised by the show will go to the Worstead Festival charity (1137770).
- Prizes awarded will be: 1st, 2nd and 3rd place certificates in each class. There will also be ‘Best in Show’ and ‘Runner up’ certificates awarded.
- The Festival organisers cannot be responsible for your property, although an organiser will be in attendance at all times.
- The judges’ decision, whatever it may be, should be accepted with good grace. Any grievances should be lodged in writing to the show organisers.
- Winners’ names and photographs may be printed in publicity material.

PHOTOGRAPHY CLASS

- Photographs must be taken by the competitor.
- No larger than A4 (21 cm x 29.7cm), unmounted and not in frames.
- Photography can be digital or otherwise, and any darkroom or digital manipulation is allowable.
- In the Worstead-themed image, if the link to Worstead isn’t immediately obvious, provide a brief explanation.

FRUIT, VEGETABLES AND FLOWER CLASSES

- All entries must have been grown by the competitor, with the exception of 28 where shop bought flowers may be used.
- You must bring your own plates, vases etc to use for your display.

HOME PRODUCE, CRAFT AND FUN CLASSES

- All entries must have been made/baked by the competitor (or laid by their chickens).
- Home produce classes may be taste tested by the judges.
- Food entered (such as scones and cakes) will be placed in a paper and cellophane food bag by the organisers, on arrival.
- Decorated jars can be decorated in any medium and displayed with a battery operated ‘tea light’. No lit candles are allowed in the Grown in Norfolk tent.
- Fruit and/or vegetables used to make the creature, 32, need not be grown by the competitor and shop bought ‘googly eyes’ are permitted.
- The painted decorated rock or large stone, class 33, will not be auctioned. In line with the guidance on the Norfolk Rocks (UK) Facebook page, no money will change hands, instead donated rocks will ‘rock’ Worstead village on day two of the festival. Ensure the rocks are sealed with varnish and have the following on the reverse: “Please post a photo on NORFOLK ROCKS (UK) FB #worsteadfestival2018”.
- Clearly mark what the offering in class no 38 is free from, eg gluten/egg/dairy etc.
